Annual Championships Mon 25th Feb – Thu 7th March 2019

Like last season this Championships will be played on weekday evenings over two weeks. With the final played on the evening of Thursday 7th March at Clapham Road.

We are introducing a ping pong competition this year. Standard hard sandpaper bats will be supplied so no need to provide your own. It's an interesting game that has its own different skill elements that will be fun and entertaining. Hope you can support it. Further information is attached.

We will be using three different venues and the Men's Singles event being played over the two weeks so please ensure you know where and when you will be playing. A schedule is below to help you plan.

Key things to note....

- Entering **4 events** or more is now fee capped and discounted to encourage entry
- There are 14 events. With several ladies competing in the league there are a number of events you can enter. As well as the **Ladies Singles** there will be **Ladies Doubles** and **Mix Doubles** and we invite a good entrant to this event
- There are two young person's events to consider, whether you are under **15** or under **21 (Youth Singles)**. Please consult the rules attached to the entry form for details of age restrictions.
- Similarly there are three veterans events to consider, **40+ Singles** , **40+ Doubles** and **60+ Singles**
- Because of the inclusive of ladies and mixed doubles we welcome back the **Men's Doubles**. This is open to all male players including younger players.
- The **Ping Pong Singles** was very successful last year and will be played at the Clapham Road and has an early start time.
- And for Division 2 players there is **D2 Singles** and **D2 Doubles** events (with no restriction to sex in the doubles)
- For those entering the **Men's Singles** please note that the Quarter and Semi Finals will be played the following Wednesday and the Final the next evening. This is always a well-attended event and will be played using groups to ensure all players get plenty of opportunity to compete.
- 11 up scoring system will be used for all events except the handicap

Please note the finals this year will be on the evening of Thursday 7th March. We request that players check which events scheduled to be played at this final and ensure that you will be able to attend that evening should you be fortunate enough to progress to the finals. All the trophies will be presented that evening and everyone is welcome to come along whether playing or spectating.

To be eligible to enter the Individual Championships, a player must be registered with a team in the Lowestoft Table Tennis League for at least 4 weeks at the time of entry. The Competition Rules are attached to the entry forms and are supplemented by the League Handbook. If you require any further information about eligibility criteria, additional entry forms or any other matter please do not hesitate to contact me.

The closing date for entries is Sunday 17th February 2019.

Lowestoft Ping Pong Competition for Championships 2019

Taking inspiration from the World Ping Pong Championships at Ally Pally, which was on Sky at the end of January, the Lowestoft District Table Tennis League has decided to host a competition during the Championships using this format.

The game that fell out of favour with the advent of super-spin inducing rubber bats years ago is returning to the mainstream thanks to a potent mixture of speed, power and old-fashioned skill courtesy of the technology-free sandpaper bats. Now into its 6th year at the iconic Alexandra Palace the World Championships is a throwback to the early days of table tennis and is catapulting ping pong into the big league and onto the international television stage.

So what's different to Table Tennis?

- Everyone uses the same equipment. The bats are made with sandpaper rather than rubber and sponge, effectively making a hard bat. Although you can create spin it's not as extreme as table tennis. You swap bats after every set to avoid any chance of one bat performing better. This makes it purely about skill and craft rather than using the latest, most advanced equipment / technology.
- Sets are played up to 15 points with a sudden death point at 14-14 (no deuce)
- On your serve you can elect, once during the match, to choose a two point ball. You cannot win a set by doing this so it must be taken before you reach 13. If the player serving / electing to use the 2 point ball wins the rally they get, yep you got it, 2 points. If you are defending the two point ball, returning serve, and win the rally you get a standard one point. To signal a two point ball rally an orange ball is selected and used for that rally only. This adds an interesting tactical dynamic to the game as to when you choose to use your 2 point ball.
- Everything else is the same.
